Location: Islamabad, Bagha Bazaar, Cachar, Assam.



A Historical pond in a village, Islamabad, Bhaga Bazar. This village has a very large pond known as Rajar Dighi. The pond was dug by a king several centuries before the arrival of the British. After ruling for many years, the king disappeared, and the area gradually became covered with dense forest.



During the British period, people came from different places to settle and clear the forest. While cultivating the land, settlers discovered the huge pond. The surrounding jungle was cleared and the area was made suitable for daily human activities.
